THE BOMBING OF DARWIN 19TH FEBRUARY 1942

The Bombing of Darwin, also known as the Battle of Darwin, on 19 February 1942 was the largest single attack ever mounted by a foreign power on Australia. On that day, 242 Japanese aircraft, in two separate raids, attacked the town, ships in Darwin Harbour and the town's two airfields in an attempt to prevent the Allies from using them as bases to contest the invasion of Timor and Java during World War II.

Darwin was lightly defended relative to the size of the attack, and the Japanese inflicted heavy losses upon Allied forces at little cost to themselves. The urban areas of Darwin also suffered some damage from the raids and there were a number of civilian casualties. More than half of Darwin's civilian population left the area permanently, before or immediately after the attack.^{[6][7]}

The two Japanese air raids were the first, and largest, of more than 100 air raids against Australia during 1942–1943. The event happened just four days after the Fall of Singapore, when a combined Commonwealth force surrendered to the Japanese, the largest surrender in British history.

THE BOMBING OF BROOME 3RD MARCH 1942

The tiny pearling port of Broome, Western Australia, became a transit stop on the escape route for refugees fleeing the Japanese advance in the Netherlands East Indies. On Tuesday morning, 3 March 1942, ten Japanese aircraft attacked both the airfield there and the flying boats refuelling at anchor on nearby Roebuck Bay. In an attack lasting an hour the Japanese fighters destroyed 16 flying boats on the bay and six aircraft on the ground.

When expectation vs reality doesn't match on Valentine's Day

Sending your loved one wilted flowers on Valentine's Day probably won't get you the reaction you were hoping for. Before you get a bunch of dead roses thrown in your face, Consumer Protection hopes there's time to explain you have rights under Australian Consumer Law (ACL).

Consumer guarantees kick in on products purchased through Australian-based stores, including online.

When a V-Day gift arrives but isn't what was advertised, such as flowers that are significantly different to the photo, or are wilted, you have a right to a remedy under the ACL, such as a refund, replacement or repair.

You also have rights if your special someone receives their gift late and you were guaranteed a V-Day delivery.

In the first instance, contact the retailer and see what they can do for you. Remember – you do not have to accept a credit note as a remedy.

Guarantees also apply on products purchased through overseas traders, however it is much harder to enforce, so keep this in mind when doing your shopping.

West Aussies should continue to be vigilant to scammers when shopping online. In 2023, online shopping scams claimed 305 WA victims, who lost a combined \$631,315.

To avoid being scammed, look out for social media businesses that display few or no contact details, as well as poorly edited ads with bad English. Also, don't pay for gifts through direct bank transfer, only use PayPal or credit card so you can dispute or request a reversal of charges if your gifts don't arrive.

If you're looking online for a special someone, you should be on high alert for romance scammers as Valentine's Day approaches.

Once a romance scammer has established trust, they will share elaborate stories and ask for money they say is to cover costs with illness, injury, business expenses, duty or customs fees, legal costs, family crises, or travel. Consumer Protection advises you to never share your bank account or credit card details with, or transfer money to, someone you haven't met in person.





From The Shire Archives

Well the one positive thing about this week is that a lot of records work is done inside. You might get the image of dusty books, off colour pages and handwritten manuscripts which wouldn't be too far from the truth. In the last few weeks I have had a bit of an investigation happening. This has meant going back to the 1960's looking for a potential needle in a haystack but important information nether the less. The Shire of Carnamah have the minute and agenda books going all the way back to the 1930's and yes they are dusty but nicely bound. When given tasks to go back into this part of our history what information should I record becomes an interesting question. Information that is recorded may include building notes, strategic council decisions, staff records and even some of the groups that existed that made Carnamah what it is today.

While waiting for the Electors Meeting last week I came across an Electors Meeting from the 1960's where over 40 people attended, granted it was a meeting related to the annexation of the Shire of Coorow from Carnamah but it was interesting to note how these meetings have evolved over time. Communication these days is probably one reason we have less electors turn up to meetings. Updates can now come via Social Media.

We are having a look through some of the boxes in the Archive Room to give you a bit of an idea of the information that local government holds. The next box we are looking at is one called Gas Pipelines. The Dampier to Bunbury Natural Gas Pipeline, as you with a bit of Geographic knowledge may understand, passes through the Shire of Carnamah... Where???

out towards our friends in Eneabba. This was a massive State Government project that began in 1982 and the pipeline reached Bunbury in 1985 (try get that done today). There were land agreements, environmental impact statement, building and planning document and general correspondence all related to this project. Each record need to be kept as an Archive for the State Records Office of WA. So that is what has happened. Every now and then I do have to go back and have a look through this box as there may be information related to locations and the building of the pipeline that interferes with modern endeavors. With the expansion of new technologies I have the feeling that there might be a few more "gas" pipelines into the future, possibly hydrogen but we shall watch this space (or the archive box).
